
#### **TUTOR's comment and CLUB NEWS**



#### THIS WEEK'S PRODUCT

(available from Timberly Turning - Terry Scott)

#### The OUTRIGGER



The arm system articulates out to give adequate clearance from the spindle for work with a thickness up to 8.5"(215mm).

The arm articulates through a wide arc, and the tool-rest post can be locked along the length of the arm to allow for all shapes and sizes of woodturning.

The unit is easily bolted in place at the end of the headstock bed casting and requires no more room allowance than the normal lathe because the unit is designed to be used with the <a href="swivel headstock">swivel headstock</a> in front of NOVA lathe.

- Fits Nova 3000 and Nova DVR, Nova DVR XP & Nova 1624-44 lathes.
- Handles work up to 29" (740mm) in diameter.
- Space saving does not add to lathe footprint.
- Very quick & easy to swing into operation, giving extra capacity within seconds.
- Includes instruction manual, fastenings.



An outrigger fitted to your lathe would be great for turning bowls as you would no longer have to bend over the lathe bed to get into the wood. Much larger diameter work is achievable. The solid and heavy OUTRIGGER is worth its weight in gold being an absolute boon for left handers like me.

The Hamilton Wood Turners' Club has just one of these **OUTRIGGERS** (fixed to Lathe No 13)

An ultimate goal is to have an outrigger attached to every club lathe.
