TUTOR's comment and CLUB NEWS

- 1. Astra-dot sanding disks have been placed into labelled containers for club members to make a selection when using a mandrel for power sanding. These are on sale as a fundraiser to support the equipment replacement programme. Please place fifty cents per disk into the container provided. Many thanks!
- **2.** Today's edition of the TT contains a **chart of appropriate drilling speeds** when using the club's set of **Forstner bits**. Members are asked to use this chart to ensure all steps have been taken to prevent further damage to the bits. The chart makes recommendations for drilling both hardwoods and softwoods.
- **3.** A stack of kauri wood recovered from a young tree has been processed for future use by members. This includes slabbing and end-sealing.
- 4. Last night was the tenth and final session for Course No 3 so the Thursday-ites celebrated another 10-week learning journey with a shared supper and story telling. Next Thursday another evening course No 4 gets underway. (3 hours per session)
- 5. Next Tuesday is the fifth and final session for Course No.6. The following Tuesday another fiveweek (6 hours per session) begins. There are spots available for this course.
- **6.** More equipment has been added to the club's list of turning tools including: seven rolls of astra-dot sandpaper; an extension bar for Forstner bit drilling; black CA (Starbond) glue; glue-hardening spray.
- 7. I have repaired the handle of the "bacon slicer" that is used for cutting with the large band saw.
- **8.** RAFFLE FUNDRAISER. Members are asked to include a couple of gold coins in their pockets for the next few weeks to support a regular special raffle of a parcel of turning goodies. This is just another fundraising initiative to support the new equipment and replacement tools programme.

THIS WEEK Caring for your Forstner-style drill bits

I am often asked "What speed should I use to drill?" - when **Forstner style bits** are to be used for drilling. Here's a table of useful information that I found on the INTERNET. The site I searched has been a reliable source of info in the past years.

Please keep this information sheet handy in your tool boxes for future reference. Use the following charts to get the best performance from your Forstner bits:
