MORE ABOUT THE SKEW TOOL (TOOL FOR THIS MONTH)

Sessions this month start with a 10- 15-minute practice time using the skew tool. Last Saturday ROBERT WISELEY spent a couple of hours sharpening all our skews. <u>Many thanks to you Robert.</u>

By the end of this month we expect that everyone is better skilled in sharpening their own skew chisel.

Have another look at Terry Scott demonstrating the skew sharpening process. All members should consider this visit to <u>You Tube</u> as part of this month's skew training programme.

OK go to Google and then type: "How to Sharpen the Woodcut oval skew" (3.19) Observe the technique as presented by Terry Scott and note the advice about jig settings.

STEPHEN used Chinese elm wood to make his deeply undercut rimmed bowl. This was a real sanding challenge but perseverance paid dividends.






This kauri project is a strong indicator that wood turning is going from good to great for our **ROBBIE.**
