Precision fitted and all neatly contained in purpose-built rimu wood boxes.






Talent combined and a joint effort here: a three tiered stand made from recycled rimu wood.

EEE ULTRA SHINE

This pasty stuff is found in most of our workshops and is being used with almost every turning project produced by our club members.

Thus we would do well to know what it is and how it can be used. Printed below are a few useful ideas about EEE **Cheers Clive**



EEE - Ultra Shine is a cut and polish paste wax containing **Tripoli** powder (also known in Australia as Rotten Stone) an ultra-fine abrasive. The polish is designed to be used in conjunction with Shellawax Cream & liquid or as a finish in its own right on plastics and some stone.

It can also be used by French Polishers after polishing and restorers to cut & polish old polished surfaces.

Many other finishes will also be greatly enhanced **by using EEE -Ultra Shine to finish the finish.** These include Organ Oil, Danish oil, polyurethane, nitrocellulose lacquer, French polish, spirit varnish, spa vanish, etc.

Using EEE

EEE - Ultra Shine has the unique ability of breaking down the grit size as you use it. However, instead of becoming blunt like most other abrasives it continues to cut which takes your finish to a higher and higher shine as you continue to work.

For <u>wood turners</u> it also has the ability of removing sanding marks from most timbers and can greatly reduce your sanding time whilst giving you a far better finished surface than you have ever had before. <u>A</u> blemish free surface pre-polished and ready to apply your finish to.

If you sand to 240 (or higher) grit then use EEE it will give you about the equivalent of sanding with 2,000+ grit or more.

The higher grit abrasive paper you use before using EEE the better your finish will be. If you sand to 1200 - 1500 grit and then use EEE you will get about the equivalent of sanding up to somewhere between 20,000 & 30,000 grit depending on the material you are working on ant the length of time you are prepared to put into the application (rubbing)..

In pretty well all cases what you will be left with is a surface that shows no sanding marks and is ready to have Shellawax or Shellawax Cream applied to it as a final finish which is **guaranteed to knock your** eyes out.

If you use either of the Shellawaxes and are amazed at the finish you get with them, **prepare yourself to be astounded**.

FOR WOODTURNERS REQUIRING THE ULTIMATE FINISH
